The first item was the introduction and approval of the agenda. It was moved by Kurtenbach, seconded by Vick, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, review and consider approval of the minutes of May 14, 2026, and July 09, 2026, meeting. It was moved by Kurtenbach, seconded by Kobliska, to approve the minutes as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Discussion Items.

1. NADO National Award - INRCOG received the 2026 Excellence in Regional Transportation Award for its FY 2026–2030 Passenger Transportation Plan (PTP)

Fratzke mentioned that the INRCOG FY 2026–2040 PTP received the NADO 2026 Excellence in Regional Transportation Award, emphasizing that the recognition reflects a collective team effort. Fratzke noted that PTP outlines strategies and initiatives for the next five years, including the Microtransit initiative, among other key goals. Fratzke highlighted the various accolades the plan has received, both from the Iowa DOT and at the national level, as recognition of the quality and collaborative effort behind the plan.

2. Project updates

a. City and county project updates

- **Black Hawk County**, Brennan noted that Donald St., paving has been completed and the project is currently undergoing an audit with the DOT.
- **City of Cedar Falls**, Wicke mentioned that Main Street is addressing remaining punch-list items, while 27th/Union Rd. remains in design, with bidding expected in late fall/early winter and

construction next year. Sweeney reported that Greenhill Rd./IA 58 is moving toward final design, with public meetings, right-of-way impacts, and NEPA activities underway; letting is anticipated in late 2028, with construction planned for 2029.

- **City of Waterloo**, Hemann stated that La Porte is scheduled for letting in November. The USDOT funding has not yet been signed or obligated.
- **City of Gilbertville**, Hemann reported that 5th Street was bid in July, and slightly above estimate. Finalize contract, with some concrete work and the overlay potentially taking place this year.
- **Raymond**, Vick reported that Lafayette Road is substantially complete, with final grading finished
- **DOT** – no major updates.

b. Microtransit Solutions

Sturch noted that the Microtransit initiative has been in development ongoing and is now at the funding stage, with potential funders from the Union Block, DOT, and local jurisdictions. The three-year pilot is intended to complement gaps in first- and last-mile connectivity to the existing fixed-route system, with potential for expansion based on demand and performance. Next steps include presenting to city councils to secure buy-in. Fratzke added that discussions are ongoing with major employers, including Tyson and UnityPoint Health.

c. NEIA NEPA Study

Durbahn provided a comprehensive presentation on the NEIA Study, noting collaboration with the steering committee, Iowa DOT, and INRCOG to refine the recommended alternatives. Next steps include presenting the recommendations to city councils and establishing a framework for jurisdictions to pursue potential grant opportunities through the FHWA or FRA to help fund some of the preferred projects.

3. General discussion.

Setu provided an update on NOFOs/grant opportunities, including ICAAP, TAP, and FRT. Setu mentioned the DOT requesting public comments for the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and State Long Range Transportation Plan (SLRTP).

4. Adjournment

There being no further business, a motion was made by Kobliska, seconded by Kurtenbach. Motion carried unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 11:07 am.
